SUBJECT	<b>EDU 4</b> - Discussion and Possible Action to Seek Legislation for Probationary Status and Disciplinary Options Regarding Dental Hygiene Educational Programs

### **Background**

Pursuant to § 1905 of the Business and Professions Code, the Dental Hygiene Committee of California is responsible for evaluating and approving or withholding approval of all registered dental hygienist, registered dental hygienist in alternative practice, and registered dental hygienist in extended functions educational programs in the State of California. The Committee is only authorized to grant or renew approval of programs that continuously maintain acceptable standards, as described in § 1941. Under current law, if the Committee has cause to believe that such a program is out of compliance with standing regulations, the Committee must, in the interest of consumer protection, withdraw approval of the program. There currently exists no intermediary status or any other measure to bring programs into compliance when their violations are minor or would likely be remedied if given the opportunity.

It has become apparent that situations could arise in which an educational program is out of compliance in some areas, but once notified, would cooperatively correct the deficiencies to bring the program back into compliance. In such a case, it may be in the best interest of the consumer for the program to undergo a remediation process rather than having its approval fully withdrawn.

Protecting the consumer is the primary objective in every Committee decision. Consumers are better off when they have access to well-trained hygienists. Unless a deficient program is engaged in activity that poses an immediate threat to public health or safety, the consumer would likely benefit most if there were a method for remediating deficiencies rather than immediately withdrawing approval of educational programs. When Committee approval is withdrawn, the program is subject to closure. This affects enrolled students as well as people residing in the region where the school is based. Effects from a school closure could include fewer hygienists in the profession due to the program no longer producing graduates, may pose access to care issues including longer wait times for an appointment, and increased health risks to consumers.

Students are also consumers. When a program's approval is withdrawn, the students of that program are negatively impacted, usually through no fault of their own. Students who have, in good faith, committed their time, financial resources, and best efforts to work through a Committee approved program, with the expectation that they would

have the opportunity to become licensed hygienists, should not lose the chance to realize their career aspirations.

# **Staff Recommendations:**

Staff recommends that the Committee seek legislation and regulations to create a framework of progressive disciplinary options that would allow the Committee to do the following:

- cite and fine for minor violations of standing regulations;
- place a program on probationary status for more serious violations; and
- retain the option of withdrawing approval of programs that commit the most egregious violations.

Staff recommends that the Education Subcommittee petition the Full Committee to appoint up to two members to work with staff on this task.
