Hi Tony,

Currently DHCC has 66 SIR's and 3 Work Authorizations. Items 1-6 are scheduled for release January 9, 2019. Item 7-8 scheduled for later date in 2019.

SIR's include:

- 1. Revision to all of the DHCC's website.
- 2. Creation of the Retired Status Transaction;
- 3. New Retired License Fee Code;
- 4. Update DHCC Profile Reports for all license types and transactions;
- 5. New Hard Card Fingerprints modifier and fee code;
- 6. Revisions to the WREB/CRDTS Application transaction to reflect the new law requiring 2 years satisfactory completion of the dental hygiene examination given by WREB or CRDTS for the last examination; and
- 7. 37 correspondence revision to reflect the new Boards name and any other edits;
- 8. **Work Authorization for**: Mobile Dental Hygiene Unit, Special Permit and Additional Office Permit Status deferred until DHCC has established a regulatory package.
